WHAT IS FINDING HOME ABOUT?

Finding Home tells the story of three young Cambodian women trapped in sex-trafficking, the story of their rescue and the search to find a place called home. It brings to life the brutal and evil world of modern day slavery.

Through three years of filming their post trafficking experiences, filmmaker Derek Hammeke allows these young women to reveal their stories with dignity. Viewers will see the devastation and heartache of these tragic stories, but will also experience hope and joy as they journey with these young women on a path from victim to survivor.

Finding Home reminds us that we are all connected in our humanity; that we are all looking for a place of love, acceptance and community. A place called home.



WHAT IS RAPHA HOUSE INTERNATIONAL?

Rapha House is a public benefit 501©3 nonprofit committed to ending the trafficking and sexual exploitation of children. Founded in 2003, Rapha House continues to rescue and rehabilitate children, while bringing them to lasting freedom. While their headquarters are at 112 Main Street, Suite B in Joplin, MO Rapha House is truly making a global impact. They operate four safe houses in Southeast Asia and are currently working on opening a house in Haiti.



WHAT IS HUMAN TRAFFICKING?

Human trafficking is defined by the UN as the:

“Illegal trade in human beings for the purposes of commercial sexual exploitation or forced labor; a modern day form of slavery.”

The United Nations estimates nearly 2.5 million people from 127 different countries are trafficked each year.

Although the statistics are difficult to verify, it is believed that between one million and 1.5 million children are trafficked each year.

HOW CAN I SCREEN THE FILM?

After requesting this screening packet from www.findinghomefilm.com there are a few extra steps to make sure your screening experience is as powerful as possible.

Form a Team

Don't do this alone! Please ask at least one other person to help you with the process.

Screening this film requires more than just pressing play.

Together you will: locate the venue, prepare the venue, prepare your hearts, invite your friends, and then take action.

Locate the Venue

There is not end to the places you can show this film. You can host an event at your church, a civic organization, a school or even your home. If you can play the movie, you can host the a screening.

Prepare the Venue

Make sure you have the proper equipment and venue to screen the film

Equipment – Test your DVD or Blu-Ray on the projector or television you will be using for the screening.

Make sure the screen is visible from all angles and that the picture is properly sized.

Make sure you will have adequate control of the volume and lighting.

Venue – Plan ahead so that there will be no distractions during the film.

Also ensure that there will be necessary accommodations such as restrooms.

Prepare Your Hearts

The full version of the film is two hours long. Prepare your heart and mind for a full length film with heavy emotional material.

Consider praying for emotional connection and conviction before the film even starts.

Tell Your Friends, Family and More

We want you to screen this film with as many people as you can invite. Invite your friends, neighbors and co-workers. Invite your family.

Advertise to your Facebook friends. Invite the press! You can't make a big impact with the screening if you do it in secret.

Take Action

Don't forget about these girls when you are finished with the film – and make sure no one else does either. Take action!
